ICFF 2016 is just around the corner

TORONTO, Monday May 9, 2016 at 10 a.m. – At the Ritz-Carlton Hotel, the press conference will be introducing the films featured in this years festival and will mark the opening of ticket sales. The fifth edition will be taking place from June 9-17 in various cities across Canada (Toronto, Montreal, Québec, Hamilton and Niagara Falls and Vaughan).

This will event will bring the festival to a close. Drawing over 900 guests, the gala will feature an awards ceremony that will be accompanied by creative entertainment, live music and an upscale buffet catered from Toronto's best bakeries and restaurants along with an open bar for the evening.
